THE EXEGETICAL OUTLINE An exegetical outline traces the thought-flow of the passage. If the analytical outline is fluid and no two people will develop exactly the same outline, the EO is even more so. Not only will you not develop the same outline as the person next to you, you will not develop the same outline a month or a year from now.

Analytical, Exegetical & Teaching Outlines

This is fifteen verses, which is about the most you should consider doing for a typical exegesis paper. Shifts in time ("and it came to pass"), shifts in location ("went up to Jerusalem"), and shifts in topic ("There is therefore no condemnation to those who are in the Messiah Jesus") all indicate the beginning of a new narrative pericope or a new topic.

Exegetical Papers: 1. Choose a Passage & Create a Thesis ...

While there are several possibilities here, you should be able to outline the text based upon either content (e.g., theme 1,2, and 3) or literary structure (e.g., vision, rhetorical question, argument, result, location notice, description of speaker, reason, time notice, etc.). This outline should be at about one half to one page in length.
