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The Passive Voice Perfect English

In this case, we can use a passive, which puts the object first: Two cups of coffee were drunk (we can add 'by me' if we want, but it isn't necessary). How to make the Passive in English. We make the passive by putting the verb 'to be' into whatever tense we need and then adding the past participle. For regular verbs, we make the past participle by adding 'ed' to the infinitive.

For regular verbs, we make the past participle by adding 'ed' to the infinitive. So 'play' becomes 'played'. Tense Active Passive present simple I make a cake. A cake is made (by me).

The Passive Voice - Perfect English Grammar

The passive voice is used to show interest in the person or object that experiences an action rather than the person or object that performs the action. In other words, the most important thing or person becomes the subject of the sentence.

The Passive Voice of Assertive Sentence of Present Perfect Tense can be made by applying the following sequence of rules: Convert the object of the Assertive Sentence into the subject of the Passive Voice Sentence. Use helping verb have been/ has been according to the subject of the Passive Voice Sentence. Use 3 rd form of Verb.

What is the passive voice in English grammar? If the subject of our sentence gets or receives something - something happens to the subject of our sentence - we can use the Passive Voice. Passive voice uses the verb to be (am, is, are, was, were) plus the past participle form of the verb in the main action.
